



Regional Final Rules

Regulations

- Softball Fence Distance – 130' | Baseball Fence Distance – 170'
- Pitcher will be throwing from behind an L-Screen 30'-40' from home plate
- All rules will be enforced on the field by umpires stationed at each end of the outfield fence and behind home plate
- Previous pitch must land before the next pitch can be thrown
- All participants will be able to use provided Easton bats however they may use their own if they prefer

Round 1 – 10 Participants

- Each participant receives 90-seconds to hit as many home runs as possible
- The clock will start with the release of the first pitch
- Any fair ball that lands over the fence in fair territory is a home run
- Previous pitch must land before the next pitch can be thrown
- At the end of Round 1, the 6 participants with the most home runs will advance to Round 2

Round 2 – 6 Participants

- Order determined by first round results; lowest score goes first.
- Each participant receives 90-seconds to hit as many home runs as possible
- The clock will start with the release of the first pitch
- Any fair ball that lands over the fence in fair territory is a home run
- Previous pitch must land before the next pitch can be thrown
- At the end of Round 2, the 4 participants (Regional) with the most total home runs (combined totals from the 1st and 2nd rounds) will advance to Round 3

Round 3 – 4 Participants (Head to Head)

- All scores are reset to zero
- Matchups determined by second round results; lowest score goes first matched with highest score
- Each participant receives 90 seconds to hit as many home runs as possible
- The clock will start with the release of the first pitch
- Any fair ball that lands over the fence in fair territory is a home run
- The two individual winners will advance to the final round
- Previous pitch must land before the next pitch can be thrown
- The four finalists in this round will advance to the Championship in Williamsport PA

Round 4 – 2 Participants (Head to Head)

- All scores are reset to zero
- Order determined by third round results; lowest score goes first
- Each participant receives 90 seconds to hit as many home runs as possible
- The clock will start with the release of the first pitch
- Any fair ball that lands over the fence in fair territory is a home run
- Previous pitch must land before the next pitch can be thrown
- The results of this round will determine the T-Mobile Little League® Home Run Derby Champion – Regional – recipient of T-Mobile LL League Donation

Tie-Breakers

In the event of a tie after any round, there will be a hit-off with the participants that are tied for advancement. Each participant will receive 3 swings, the contestant with the most home runs after the 3 swings will advance to the next round or be determined the winner.

If the participants remain tied after the first tie-breaker, there will be a second hit-off. Each participant will receive 3 additional swings, the contestant with the most home runs after the 3 swings will advance to the next round or be determined the winner.

If tied or if no home runs are hit in the previous tiebreaker rounds, each participant will receive one swing each. The umpires will decide which fly ball is furthest, based on where it first hits the ground. Distance markers will be placed by umpire to mark the location of where the ball hit the ground; measurement tape may be used if necessary.

COVID Guidelines:

In the event a player tests positive for COVID 19 or is forced to withdraw from the competition in any way prior to the event beginning, Position Sports will adjust the event structure to accordingly based on the number of remaining participants.

In the event a participant must withdraw for any reason during the event, that participant will forfeit their current round score and the next best score will advance to the next round of competition should it qualify.
